Philotimo

Philotimo! What a great word; it just sort of rolls off your tongue. (By the way, it is pronounced with the accent on the second syllable and the “i’s” are pronounced as long e sounds; hence “phee lo tee mo”. It is a Greek word but the interesting thing about this word is that it really does not have a direct English translation. American President Obama, in his remarks to the Greek Prime Minister this past year, noted that philotimo is a “sense of love, to family, and to community and to country – the notion that what we are here on this earth to do is to be all in this together. We all have obligations to each other and to work together.”

For us, philotimo is also a sense of love for Christian education; that we, as church, school and home are in this together. We all have obligations to each other and to work together. But it is a word that is always used with regard to grateful living and when we are grateful, we respond to God and others by enacting other virtues. Therefore one way to define it is simply “responsive gratefulness”. It is a word that is characteristic of a state of mind, but more importantly, it is a way of life, a principle virtue that makes Christian community work. We tend to gravitate to people who are rich in philotimo. Our philotimo leads us to offer our talents and gifts in service of others – live out our gratefulness to God by actions as well as our hearts.

There are numerous things that we can do to continue to cultivate philotimo or responsive gratefulness at Immanuel Christian.

- Recognize that loving, obedient service, our grateful response to God, is what pleases our Lord.
- Having a grateful heart enables us to see everything as gifts of the Lord including the gift of Immanuel Christian School.
- Celebrate the good things that are happening at the school – things we can be thankful for.
- Acknowledge the accomplishments of our parents and grandparents and the contributions they make for ICS.
- Model gratitude in the things we say and do – model the attitude that you want to see in others.
- Thank our families for their involvement at ICS and the sacrifices they make for their children’s Christian education.
- Thank the staff for their dedication and commitment to Christian Education and in particular to Immanuel.
- Practice the art of listening; slow to speak and quick to listen. An ancient monastery motto was “speak only if you can improve on the silence”.
